Each Steering Committee meeting – from May 2020 up until the 2022 High-Level Meeting – will use this status update to discuss progress on the implementation of the 2020-22 Work Programme. The status update serves two purposes: (i) to provide progress updates of individual action areas; and (ii) to raise emerging issues, such as bottlenecks or proposed diversions from original implementation plans, including new initiatives and outputs, changes in the group of supporters or other specific proposals for information or decision by the Steering Committee. Action Area leads will be invited by the Joint Support Team to update the table ahead of each Steering Committee meeting. The Action Area Outputs from the work programme are included for ease of reference.

AA 1.1 Demonstrating the impact of effectiveness		The Working Group has started work on the preparatory steps for implementation. Drafts of the Action Area Prospectus, criteria for selecting Effectiveness to Impact initiatives and Tors for the research component have been prepared and discussed – and should be finalised in early May. Discussions on an outreach strategy and the identification of resources to support implementation are ongoing.		
AA 1.2 Support to statistical capacity and data		The work has started on the scoping paper to link the effectiveness principles to the area of statistics. A global dialogue and exchange is planned on the experience of Covid 19 and the data challenge. Preparations are ongoing to input to the World Data Forum in October 2020 and a Link to the Learning and Acceleration Program in Korea.		
AA 2.1 Private sector partnerships	Update of the Business Leader Caucus to a "2.0 version", possibly inviting new business leaders and networks to spearhead business engagement around the Kampala Principles	Further progress updates envisioned for the 20 th Meeting of the Committee in Berne, Switzerland		
AA 2.2 Triangular development co-operation	Work ongoing to further clarify complementarity between work to be carried out under the GPI and GPEDC.			

AA 2.3 South-South co- operation		Regarding the pilot monitoring exercises, as national contexts vary widely, a set of indicators will be developed and jointly agreed with each participating country. However, it is also valuable for the exercise to have common data that can highlight potential differences between SSC providers. To this effect, commonalities in indicators across countries will be sought to help this comparison. Regarding country engagement, Mexico, Rwanda and NEPAD have recently confirmed participation in the group. A first meeting of a working group is being planned for late May.
AA 2.4 Civil society partnerships	Co-Chairs are leading ad-interim. Need to ensure that work stream actors complement one another in their activities. No partner countries are engaged yet.	
AA 2.5 Reinforcing foundations' engagement	AA would benefit from the participation of additional members from the Steering Committee.	
AA 2.6 Development effectiveness at subnational level	Key partners are engaged to take a leadership role but resources still have to be discussed and figured out. No partner countries are engaged yet.	
AA 2.7 Effective multi- lateral support	The UNSDG is willing to assume co-lead role. Possible co-leadership from another partner pending. Discussions are ongoing with interested partners (Bangladesh, Sweden, IADB, IFAD, Dag Hammarskjold Foundation); further engagement from both development partners and partner-countries welcome. Exchanges ongoing on a proposal based on group discussions held at the March virtual workshop, and subsequent inputs received from partners.	Further progress updates envisioned for the 20 th Meeting of the Committee in Berne, Switzerland
Strategic Priority 3 Leveraging monitoring for action	Need to ensure adequate resourcing for this core area of work of the Partnership Co-Chairs, as lead, will be engaging those who expressed interest in SP3; aware of the importance of balanced representation across constituencies in any engagement group that is formalised. Need to ensure Steering Committee plays a role to generate commitment and demand for the monitoring reform.
