Case 1: Digital Triage and Testing Booth in Bangladesh for Pandemic Response

Early in the COVID-19 pandemic, under-privileged Dhaka residents had access to a free COVID-19 testing and triage booth, medical advice, and education materials. The innovative partnership emerged from a collaboration between social enterprise <u>Digital Healthcare Solutions</u>, private foundation the Institute for Developing Science and Health Initiatives, and the public Mugda Medical College & Hospital. The booth was supported by UKAID and Concern Worldwide. This is an inspiring story of how the Kampala Principles can be applied during a time of crisis.

Case 2: Securing Women's Access to Healthcare in Rural Colombia

In Colombia's Caldas and Risaralda states, low-income families and rural women now have access to high-quality, affordable healthcare services and preventative health education due to a public-private network led by social enterprise <u>Bive</u>, private healthcare providers, and public hospitals. Further collaboration with the <u>UNDP Business Call to Action network</u> and its development partners has enabled Bive to conduct an extensive impact assessment of one of its flagship initiatives.

Case 3: Enabling the Digital Inclusion of Smallholder Farmers in Uganda

In Kalangala District, Uganda, 2,000 small-scale oil palm farmers are using the <u>SAP Rural Sourcing</u> <u>Management</u> mobile solution to connect with producers and local and regional supply chains. The involvement of the German technology company brings digital solutions to a multi-decade partnership between the Government of Uganda, private producers, the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), and oil palm farmers.
