It provides new and relevant evidence that empowers country-level actors to understand and tackle challenges towards better development co-operation.

WHY PARLIAMENTS?

Parliaments ensure inclusive, participatory, and transparent governance by holding governments to account.

Parliaments in both developed and developing countries oversee government priorities and adopt legislation to advance the SDGs, particularly through the budget process.

Parliaments represent the people, including the most marginalized, and have the responsibility to ensure that all resources - including development assistance - are fully aligned to the needs of the communities they serve.

HOW? PARLIAMENTS AS EFFECTIVE DEVELOPMENT ACTORS

- Consult citizens, civil society, business and other constituencies to inform national development goals, policies and budgets.
- **Review** evidence of impact and results achieved by development assistance through official audits and other independent evaluations.
- Oversee aid by advocating for its inclusion in the national budget.
- Scrutinize external loans, natural resources concessions, and public-private partnership contracts to provide essential infrastructure or public services.
- **Increase** domestic resources by reforming tax systems that address effectively all forms of tax evasion and avoidance.
